[DP] denotes a rule for which the penalty is at the discretion of the Jury.

[NP] denotes a rule which cannot be protested by a competitor.

[SP] denotes a rule for which a standard penalty may be applied by the race committee without a hearing

1. Rules

- 1.1. The event will be governed by the rules as defined in the <u>Windsurfing Slalom</u> Racing Rules (WSRR).
- 1.2. The International Funboard Class Association (IFCA) <u>Championship Rules</u> apply.
- 1.3. If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.
- 1.4. In case of a discrepancy within the Notice of Race and the Sailing instructions, these Sailing Instructions will take precedence.

2. <u>Notice to Competitors</u>

Notices to competitors will be posted on the Official Notice Board (ONB) in front of the stage on the beach.

3. Changes to Sailing Instructions

- 3.1. Any change to the SI will be posted at least 15 minutes before the starting time of the race or races concerned.
- 3.2. Changes affecting the schedule of the next day's racing shall be posted:
 - within the protest time limit or
 - before AP P over A I is displayed whichever is later.
- 3.3. If oral instructions or changes to the sailing instructions will be given on the water, the flag ICF "L" shall be shown at least 5 minutes before the instructions or changes. Sufficient effort has to be made to inform all the competitors involved.

4. Signals Made Ashore

- 4.1. Signals made ashore will be displayed on the Official Flag Poles located in front of the stage on the beach.
- 4.2. When flag AP •• is displayed ashore, 1 minute is replaced with "not less than 15 minutes". This changes WSRR Race Signals.

5. Schedule of Races and Official Briefings

5.1.

Wednesday- Sunday	8-12 June	11:00	First possible warning signal
Sunday	12 June	17:00 19:00	Last possible warning signal Prize giving ceremony

- 5.2. There will be a daily skippers meeting 1 hour before the first possible warning signal of that day.
- 5.3. The starting schedule will be posted on the Official Notice board at least 15 minutes before the first warning signal of the elimination involved.
- 5.4. The schedule is subject to alteration.
- 5.5. At the discretion of the Race Committee, races may be rescheduled.
- 5.6. To alert boats that an elimination or sequence of eliminations will begin soon, the orange starting line flag will be displayed with one sound at least five minutes before a warning signal is made on the Race Committee Signal Boat on the windward end of the starting line
- 5.7. There will be a maximum of 4 eliminations per day except for the divisions that sail in single fleets.

5.8. The numbering of the eliminations will be in order of sailing, expect if an elimination is abandoned after it has been sailed.

6. <u>Class Flags</u>

6.1. Class flags will be:

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Masters and Grandmasters	IFCA Mark Maclass Coff	Black flag with white IFCA logo
Youth Men	IFCA	Blue flag with white IFCA logo
Junior Boys	IFCA WARE HORIZON	Pink flag with blue IFCA logo
Youth Women	IFCA	Yellow flag with blue IFCA logo
Junior Girls	IFCA WARE HEACTEST CONTROL	White flag with blue logo

7. Racing area and courses [DP] [NP]

- 7.1. The racing area will be as illustrated on the ONB as an area extending 75 meters beyond the course including the finishing line and their extensions, in which a board normally sails while racing and 300 meters in all directions from the starting line. See appendix A of these SIs.
- 7.2. [SP] Boards whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the racing area. Penalty for a breach of this SI will be 1point
- 7.3. The courses will be as illustrated on the ONB. The course diagram (not to

scale) will be posted on the ONB at least 15 minutes before the start of the heats to which it applies. Courses will be as prescribed in the IFCA Slalom Championship Rules or variations of it.

7.4. Restricted areas are:

- Within 200 meters distance of the ferry route: Calasetta - Carloforte

8. Marks

Mark	
Course marks	Red cylindrical buoys
Starting marks	A red cylindrical buoy
Finishing marks	A checkered mark

9. Start

- 9.1. The starting line will be between the flagpole with the orange flag on the Race Committee Signal Boat and the starting mark.
- 9.2. Start on water; according to WSRR 26.1
- 9.3. Start from beach; according to WSRR 26.2
- 9.4. The starting signals will be shown from the Race Committee Signal Boat on the windward end of the starting line, seen in the direction of the first mark or from a flagpole to windward of the starting line in case of a beach start.
- 9.5. Repetitive sound signals will be given when flag "1st substitute" > (general recall) is displayed. This changes WSRR Race Signals

10. Recalls [NP]

Recalls will be signaled accordance with WSRR 29(a).

11. Finish [DP] [NP]

11.1. The finishing line will be between the finishing mark and a pole with a checkered flag.



11.2. All boards that have finished shall keep clear of competitors still racing and shall leave and clear the racing area as soon as reasonably possible.

12. <u>Time limits</u>

- 12.1. Boards failing to start within 1 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes WSRR 63.1, A4 and A5.
- 12.2. Boards failing to finish within 2 minutes after the first board in her heat has sailed the course and finished will be scored Did Not Finish (DNF) without a hearing. This changes WSRR 63.1, A4 and A5.

13. International Jury & Protests

- 13.1. An International jury will be appointed in accordance with WSRR Appendix N.
- 13.2. Protests and requests for redress shall be made orally to a member of the jury as soon as reasonably possible after the competitor finished the race.
- 13.3. The protestor shall make every reasonably effort to bring the protestee and the witnesses if any, to the jury.

13.4. The location of the jury on the beach near the competitors area will be signaled by a white flag with "JURY".



13.5. Special attention will be for WSRR 61.1: "The protesting board shall inform the other board at the first reasonable opportunity [...] She shall also inform the race committee on the finishing line of her intention to protest as soon as practicable after she finishes or retires and shall inform the protestee [...]."

14. Scoring

14.1. WSRR Appendix A applies.

15. Safety Regulations [DP] [NP]

- 15.1. The safety of the sailboard and its entire management including insurance shall be the sole responsibility of the competitor racing the sailboard who must ensure that the sailboard is adequate to face the conditions that may arise in the course of the race. Neither the establishment of these sailing instructions nor the inspection of the board under these conditions in any way limits or reduces the absolute responsibility of the competitor for his/her board and entire management thereof. The Race Organizers, the Race Committee and the International Jury will not be responsible for any loss, damage, death or personal injury however caused to the competitors as a result of their taking part in the race or races.
- 15.2. [SP] Flotation devices: When flag "Y" is displayed, every competitor shall wear a personal flotation device that shall conform to the minimum standard ISO 12402-5 (Level 50). Penalty for a breach of this SI will be 1 point for each race.
- 15.3. [SP] If either one of the signals "N" ❖ over H" ☐, "N over A ☑, "AP ☑ over H" or "AP ☑ over A" ☑ is made on one or more RC vessels, boards shall return to the competitors area on the beach as soon as reasonably possible. Penalty for a breach of this SI will be 5 points to the race closest to the incident.
- 15.4. Competitors shall go afloat and ashore in the competitors' area only on the beach in front of the Race office.

16. Replacement of equipment [DP] [NP]

16.1. Substitution of damaged or lost equipment will not be allowed unless authorized by the Race Committee. Request for substitution shall be made in writing at the first reasonable opportunity. Forms for replacement are available at the Race Office.

17. Equipment and measurement checks [DP] [NP]

- 17.1. An Online Equipment Inspection Form shall be completed by each competitor and submitted before the end of registration on Tuesday June 7th 17:00 hrs. This changes the NOR 8.1.
- 17.2. A board or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the Class Rules and Sailing Instructions. On the water, a board can be instructed by the Race Committee to proceed immediately to a designated area for inspection.

- 17.3. Use of a foil is not permitted see Class Rule C6.1
- 17.4. [SP] National letters and numbers: Penalties for breaches of WSRR appendix G may be less than disqualification. Penalty for a breach of this SI will be 1 point for every race

18. Event Advertising [DP] [NP]

- 18.1. Competitors are required to wear the advertising lycra, as provided by the organizer at the registration, while racing and training and on the race site. In case of loss or damage of the original lycra vest a new lycra vest can be collected at the race office. A refundable deposit of 20 euros shall be paid and returned if the spare Lycra vest is returned undamaged at the end of the event.
- 18.2. The lycra vest shall be worn outside other clothing when going afloat for training or racing.
- 18.3. Organizers sail stickers are mandatory on all sails. The sticker shall not be cut or adopt in any way.

19. Shore Regulations [DP] [NP]

- 19.1. The instructions of the RC or the Beach master shall be strictly obeyed.
- 19.2. Unless otherwise directed by the organizing authority, boards and equipment shall be launched and retrieved from the designated area at the event site.

20. Trash disposal [DP] [NP]

20.1. Trash may be placed aboard of support- and race committee boats

21. Prizes & Titles

- 21.1. Trophies may be awarded to the first three competitors in each valid division.
- 21.2. The first competitor in the championship ranking for youth men shall be declared: "2022 IFCA Youth Men Slalom European Champion".
- 21.3. The first competitor in the championship ranking for youth women shall be declared: "2022 IFCA Youth Women Slalom European Champion".
- 21.4. The first competitor in the championship ranking for junior boy shall be declared: **"2022 IFCA Junior Boy Slalom European Champion.**"
- 21.5. The first competitor in the championship ranking for junior girl shall be declared: "2022 IFCA Junior Girl Slalom European Champion".
- 21.6. The first competitor in the championship ranking for masters men shall be declared: "2022 IFCA Masters Man Slalom European Champion."
- 21.7. The first competitor in the championship ranking for masters women shall be declared: "2022 IFCA Masters Women Slalom European Champion".

22. Disclaimer of Liability

- 22.1. Competitors participate in the event entirely at their own risk. See WSRR 4,
- 22.2. Decision to Race. The organizing authority or any of their officials or representatives or sponsors or their officials or representatives will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the event.

23. Official Ceremonies

The attendance of all competitors to the opening and closing ceremonies are mandatory, however, the organizing authority may refuse entry to those whose standard of attire is not commensurate with the occasion. **Prize winners may forfeit prizes for non-attendance at the prize giving ceremony**.



APPENDIX -A-

RACING AREAS



The areas are defined as follows: not closer than 75 meters to any board racing (except a board in distress requiring assistance) or to a mark, layline or rumbline, and inside the course trapezoid. Until the starting signal boards whose warning signal has not been made and coach boats shall be at least 300 meters below the starting line or its extensions
